Sustainable, low carbon mobility is a high priority for all governments, especially in the Global South. National and sub-national governments are looking to develop transport systems that improve equity, ensure access, enhance prosperity, contribute to health and well-being and ameliorate the adverse environmental impacts of transport emissions. Over half of the world's population live in cities, which account for 70% of global emissions. Within cities, transport makes up a third of all emissions. As urbanisation accelerates in the Global South, transforming urban transport and mobility systems is becoming an increasingly salient lever to deliver on the above outcomes. Across geographies, this is a momentous task. Efforts to decarbonise specific transport modes are already underway, and some cities are demonstrating what is possible, but widespread systemic transformation is now needed.

The forum provide an opportunity to discuss global challenges and solutions for scaled up public and private finance for sustainable transport infrastructure and vehicles; as well as capacity building needs to integrate modes and formal and informal sectors.

In addition, the COP27 Presidency flagship initiative on Low Carbon Transport for Urban Sustainability (LOTUS) will be announced.
